## **Part 1 Preliminary**

### **1 Short title**

This subordinate local law may be cited as *Subordinate Local Law No. 2 (Animal Management) 2015*.

### **2 Purpose and how it is to be achieved**

The purpose of this subordinate local law is to supplement *Local Law No. 2 (Animal Management) 2015*, which regulates the keeping and control of animals within the local government area.

### **3 Authorising local law**

The making of the provisions in this subordinate local law is authorised by *Local Law No. 2 (Animal Management) 2015* (the **authorising local law**).

### **4 Definitions**

- (1) Particular words used in this subordinate local law have—
  - (a) the same meaning as provided for in the authorising local law; or
  - (b) the definition in the dictionary in Schedule 1.

## **Part 2 Keeping of animals**

### **5 Circumstances in which keeping animals prohibited—Authorising local law, s 5(1)**

For section 5(1) of the authorising local law, keeping an animal or animals mentioned in column 1 of Schedule 2 is prohibited in the circumstances described in column 2 of Schedule 2.

### **6 Circumstances in which keeping animals requires approval—Authorising local law, s 6(1)**

For section 6(1) of the authorising local law, keeping an animal or animals of the species or breed mentioned in column 1 of schedule 3 requires approval in the circumstances described in column 2 of schedule 3.

### **7 Animals that must be desexed—Authorising local law, s 7(1)**

For section 7(1) of the authorising local law, an animal of the species or breed mentioned in column 1 of Schedule 4 must be desexed once it reaches the age specified in column 2 of Schedule 4, except in the circumstances described in column 3 of Schedule 4.

### **8 Minimum standards for keeping animals—Authorising local law, s 8(1)**

- (1) For section 8(1) of the authorising local law, the minimum standards for the keeping of animals generally are set out in schedule 5.
- (2) For section 8(2) of the authorising local law, column 2 of schedule 6 sets out the minimum standards for keeping an animal of the species or breed mentioned in column 1 of schedule 6.

## **9 Identification for dogs in certain circumstances—Authorising local law, s 9**

For section 9 of the authorising local law, the identification required for a dog that is at a place other than the address stated in the registration notice for the dog is the registration device mentioned in section 12(3) of the *Animal Management (Cats and Dogs) Act 2008*.

## **Part 3 Control of animals**

### **10 Public places where animals are prohibited—Authorising local law, s 10(1)**

For section 10(1) of the authorising local law, the species or breeds of animals mentioned in column 2 of schedule 7 are prohibited in the public places described in column 1 of schedule 7.

### **11 Dog off-leash areas—Authorising local law, s 11(1)**

For section 11(1) of the authorising local law, the areas described in schedule 8 are designated as dog off-leash areas.

### **12 Animal faeces in public places—Authorising local law, s 13**

For section 13 of the authorising local law, the following animals are prescribed as animals whose faeces must be removed from a public place and disposed of in a sanitary way—

Dogs

### **13 Requirements for proper enclosures for keeping animals—Authorising local law, s 14(2)**

For section 14(2) of the authorising local law, column 2 of schedule 9 sets out the requirements for proper enclosures for an animal of the species or breed mentioned in column 1 of schedule 9.

### **14 Criteria for declared dangerous animals—Authorising local law, s 18(1)**

For section 18(1) of the authorising local law, the criteria for declaring an animal as a declared dangerous animal are set out in schedule 10.

## **Part 4 Seizure, impounding or destruction of animals**

### **15 Animals that may be disposed of without auction or tender—Authorising local law, s 31(1)(b)**

For section 31(1)(b) of the authorising local law, the species, breeds or classes of animal that may be sold by private agreement, destroyed or disposed of in some other way are the following—

All animals.

## **16 Register of impounded animals—Authorising local law, s 32(3)**

For section 32(3) of the authorising local law, the register of impounded animals will be kept at Woorabinda Aboriginal Shire Council, 112 Munns Drive, Woorabinda, Queensland.

## **Part 5 Appeals against destruction orders**

This part in the authorising local law does not contain any matters to be provided for by subordinate local law.

## **Part 6 Miscellaneous**

### **17 Conditions regarding sale of animals—Authorising local law, s 41(1)**

For the purposes of section 41(1) of the authorising local law, persons who offer for sale an animal of a species or breed mentioned in column 1 of schedule 11 must comply with the conditions set out in column 2 of schedule 11.

## **Part 7 Dictionary**

### **18 Animals excluded from application of the local law—Authorising local law, schedule**

For the purposes of the definition of “*animal*” in the schedule to the authorising local law, the following species of animal are excluded from the application of the authorising local law—

### **19 Species that are declared dangerous animals—Authorising local law, schedule**

For the purposes of the definition of “*declared dangerous animal*” in the schedule to the authorising local law, an animal of the following species is a declared dangerous animal—

### **20 Prescribed period for reclaiming animals—Authorising local law, schedule**

For the purposes of the definition of “*prescribed period*” in the schedule to the authorising local law, the period within which an animal may be reclaimed is—

3 business days.

## Schedule 1 Dictionary

### Section 4(1)(b)

***assistance dog*** means a guide, hearing or assistance dog certified under the *Guide, Hearing and Assistance Dogs Act 2009*.

***designated town area*** means the area defined on the map in Schedule 12.

***domestic animals*** means a cat, dog, household pet or livestock animal that is fed and kept by a person.

***multiple dwelling*** means premises which contains three or more dwellings where the use is primarily residential.

***poultry*** includes any species of fowl, duck, goose, turkey or guinea fowl.

***recognised breeder association*** means an association of animal breeders that is approved by the local government.

## Schedule 4 Requirement to desex animal

### Section 7

1.	Dogs	6 months	Dog/s— (a) owned by a member of a recognised breeders' association for the purposes of breeding or showing; or (b) <b>if it is an assistance dog.</b>
2.	Cats	6 months	1. Cat/s owned by a member of a recognised breeders' association for the purposes of breeding or showing.

## **Schedule 5      Minimum standards for keeping animals generally**

### Section 8(1)

- (1) Waste waters from enclosures must be drained in a nuisance free manner or as otherwise directed by an authorised person so that run-off is kept off adjoining land.
- (2) Excreta, food scraps, and other material that is, or is likely to become, offensive must be collected at least once in each day and, if not immediately disposed of, be kept in a fly proof container of a kind approved by an authorised person.
- (3) Any enclosure in which the animal is kept must be in a clean and sanitary condition and free from dust and odour.
- (4) Any enclosure in which the animal is kept must be properly maintained in an aesthetically acceptable condition.
- (5) All reasonable steps must be taken to prevent the animals from making a noise or disturbance that causes a nuisance or disturbance to the occupiers of other land or premises.
- (6) The area available to the animal kept on the premises must be appropriately sized so that the animal can be effectively and comfortably kept.
- (7) Any animal food must be stored in an impervious fly proof and vermin proof receptacle or in an impervious fly proof and vermin proof storeroom facility and the receptacle or storeroom facility, as the case may be, must be maintained to the satisfaction of an authorised person.
- (8) All animals kept on the premises must be provided with and have access to adequate shelter, drinking water and appropriate food.
- (9) Any enclosure used for the purpose of keeping an animal must be thoroughly cleaned each week and effectively treated with an insecticide at least twice a year.
- (10) All reasonable directions given by an authorised person to ensure that the keeping of the animal does not result in nuisance to occupiers of other land or premises, must be complied with.
- (11) Any dead animals must be immediately disposed of so as not to cause a nuisance. The remains must not be disposed of on or in a public place.

## Schedule 6 Minimum standards for keeping particular animals

Section 8(2)

1.	Bees	The keeping of bees must be conducted in accordance with the Code of Practice for Urban Beekeeping in Queensland.
2.	Cats and dogs	The owner of the cat or dog must ensure that at all times the animal is wearing the registration device mentioned in section 12(3) of the <i>Animal Management (Cats and Dogs) Act 2008</i> .
3.	Birds (budgerigars, canaries, finch, lovebirds, parrots and the like)	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. All seed and other food for the birds must be contained within a properly sealed and vermin proof container.</li> <li>2. Cages and aviaries and enclosures must be thoroughly cleaned once per week.</li> </ol>
4.	Greyhounds	Must be kept in accordance with Racing Queensland – Local Rules of Racing 2011.

### Section 13

1.	All animals	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. The enclosure must, to the reasonable satisfaction of an authorised person—               <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>(a) must be suitably fenced to contain the animal; and</li> <li>(b) must be of a size appropriate to the species and breed of the animal to be enclosed; and</li> <li>(c) may be constructed such that parts of a building or structure can form part of the enclosure in lieu of fencing, provided the building or structure does not have openings through which the animal can escape; and</li> <li>(d) must contain adequate shelter for all animals kept in the enclosure.</li> </ol> </li> <li>2. The enclosure's gates must be closed and latched except when in actual immediate use.</li> <li>3. Bulls	<p>The enclosure must—</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>(a) be constructed at least 1.8 metres in height; and</li> <li>(b) must be constructed of strong materials and designed in such a way as to prevent the animal from escaping over, under, through or around the enclosure; and</li> <li>(c) must not be within 20 metres of any residence on any adjoining premises and at least 2 metres from the boundary of any adjoining premises so that the animal can not reach through or over the boundary of the land on which it is kept.</li> </ul>
4.	Caged birds (budgerigar, canary, finch, lovebirds, parrots and the like)	<p>The cages/enclosures must—</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>(a) not be sited closer than 2 metres from the property boundaries; and</li> <li>(b) not, in combination with all buildings on site, exceed 50% of the area of the allotment; and</li> <li>(c) be located at the rear of the premises behind the residence (if any) situated on the premises.</li> </ul>
5.	Cockatoo, galah, corella and cockatiel and the like	<p>The cages/enclosures must—</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>(a) not be sited within 25 metres of any residence on adjoining premises; and</li> <li>(b) must be sited at least 2 metres from the boundary of any adjoining premises; and</li> <li>(c) not, in combination with all buildings on the allotment, exceed 50% of the area of the allotment; and</li> <li>(d) be located at the rear of the premises behind the residence (if any) situated on the premises.</li> </ul>

Horses, cows, bulls, sheep, llama, goats, deer and other animals of a similar size	<p>The enclosure must—</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>(a) be constructed to prevent any such animal from being within 10 metres of any dwelling (except any dwelling on the premises); and</li> <li>(b) be sited a minimum distance of 2 metres from the property boundaries; and</li> <li>(c) be constructed to prevent any such animal from being within 10 metres of any premises used for the manufacture, preparation or storage of food for human consumption.</li> </ul>
12.	Pigeons	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. The cage or aviary must not be sited closer than 2 metres from the property boundaries.</li> <li>2. The enclosure must be constructed to prevent any such bird from being within 10 metres of any dwelling (except any dwelling on the premises).</li> <li>3. All pigeons must be housed in purpose built facilities.</li> <li>4. Where wooden floors are used, a clear air space not less than 400 millimetres between the ground level and the underside of the flooring timbers must be provided.</li> <li>5. Where concrete floors are used, a concrete edge to the slab extending at least 600 millimetres into the ground must be provided.</li> <li>6. Pigeon lofts are to have a maximum height of 2.5 metres above natural ground level.</li> <li>7. An appropriate size of enclosure must be selected to house a maximum number of birds within the proposed loft.</li> <li>8. The maximum number of birds per cubic metre of air space must not exceed 5.</li> <li>9. Positioning of pigeon lofts must be such that the amenity of adjoining premises is preserved, with no inconvenience or nuisance resulting from this activity or from flying birds.</li> <li>10. Appropriate landing boards must be provided to encourage the uninterrupted return of birds to the loft, aviary or cage.</li> </ol>
13. ## **Schedule 10 Criteria for declared dangerous animals**

### Section 14

The following criteria will be considered prior to the declaration of an animal, other than a dog, being declared dangerous—

- whether the animal has attacked a person;
- whether the animal has attacked another animal;
- whether the animal has caused fear of attack in a person;
- whether the animal has exhibited behaviour that, in the reasonable opinion of an authorised person, gives rise to concern that it is likely to either attack a person or animal or cause fear to a person.
